Definitions

"Number of Students Who Began Program" means the number of students who began the program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all the

students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

"Students available for graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who

have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.

"Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published

program length within the reporting calendar year.

"On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

"150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-

time graduates).

"150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150%

of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.

"Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates available for

employment.

"Graduates unavailable for employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in

the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

"Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who beginning within 6 months after a student completes the

applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the 6

months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student

completes an applicable educational program.

"Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by

the number of graduates available for employment.

"Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar

year.

"First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.

"Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

"Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

"Salary" is as reported by the graduate or graduate's employer.

"No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

- 1. You have the right to cancel this agreement, including any equipment or other goods and services included in the agreement, and receive a full refund (less a depositor application fee not to exceed \$200) through attendance of the first-class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later.
- 2. Cancellations due to rejection of application, program cancellation, no show/non starts, cancellation by student during the cancellation period, will receive a full refund (less a deposit or application fee not to exceed \$200) within 45 days of cancellation date.
- 3. Your cancellation takes effect when you give written Notice of Cancellation to this school at the address above. Any written expression that you wish not to be bound by this agreement will serve as a Notice of Cancellation of this agreement. Read the Notice of Cancellation form provided to you for an explanation of your cancellation rights and responsibilities. If you have lost your Notice of Cancellation form, ask the school for a sample copy.
- 4. You are due a complete refund within 45 days after the school receives a valid Notice of Cancellation.
- 5. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a refund for the part of the course not taken.
