Contra Costa Medical Career College (CCMCC) has determined that the following programs meet the educational requirements for specific state licensing required for employment. CCMCC has only evaluated educational requirements for the State of California, where the institution is approved to operate and where all enrolled students must reside.

Phlebotomy Technician 1	CPT (CPT1)	California Department of Health Services, Laboratory Field Services (DHS-LFS)	Graduates of the Phlebotomy Technician 1 program are eligible to apply for the National Healthcareer Association’s (NHA) Certified Phlebotomy Technician Examination. Passing the NHA examination then qualifies graduates to apply to the California Department of Health Services Laboratory Field

			Services (DHS-LFS) for California State Certification, which is required for employment as a Phlebotomy Technician 1 in a laboratory setting in the state of California.
Vocational Nurse	NCLEX-PN (LVN)	Bureau of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT)	Graduates of the Vocational Nurse program are eligible to apply for the NCLEX-PN licensing examination with the Bureau of Vocational Nursing and Psychiatric Technicians (BVNPT). Nursing boards in each state establish the requirements for licensure for their state and requirements vary state by state. Students who intend to use their Contra Costa Medical Career College Vocational Nursing Diploma to secure licensure outside of the state of California will need to review the nursing licensing board in that state and contact them to verify eligibility.

Graduates of the DMS program will be eligible to sit for the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists (ARRT®) exam upon graduation. Once the graduate passes the ARRT® exam he/she may then sit for the ARDMS specialty exams including the OBGYN, Abdominal, and Vascular Credentialing exams.

Physical Location Determination

Contra Costa Medical Career College (CCMCC) determines the student's physical location during the admissions process. Applicants share their address on the Application for Admission. Their address is verified through a government issued ID that is collected as part of the admissions process. Students located outside of California are not accepted into Contra Costa Medical Career College.

Students at Contra Costa Medical Career College can update their personal information, including address, by completing a Student Information Form (please see your campus Registrar). Please note, students must notify the institution if they plan to relocate out of state.

If an enrolled student moves out of California, Contra Costa Medical Career College provides direct notice to the student via email within 14 days after the day the change in determination is identified by Legacy Education. Relocating out of state may adversely impact a student's ability to complete their program. Students are encouraged to speak with CCMCC staff before relocating to determine options for continuing training or withdrawing prior to moving outside of California.
